SUBJECT: Resolution to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures, pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) thereof, the procurement of a sixth amendment to an agreement with Satellite Tracking of People, LLC for the provision of electronic monitoring services used in the supervision and tracking of individuals under the supervision of the Department of Probation in order to extend the term of the agreement commencing retroactively on March 1, 2026 through August 31, 2026 in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.

Authority is hereby requested from your Honorable Board to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures (the "Policy"), pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) thereof, the procurement of a sixth amendment ("Sixth Amendment") to an agreement with Satellite Tracking of People, LLC ("STOP") for the provision of electronic monitoring services used in the supervision and tracking of individuals under the supervision of the Department of Probation in order to extend the term commencing retroactively on March 1, 2026 through August 31, 2026 in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.

By way of background, on February 27, 2020, your Honorable Board authorized the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through the Department of Probation (the "Department"), to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement") with STOP, for the provision of electronic monitoring services used in the supervision and tracking of individuals under the supervision of the Department, for a term commencing on March 1, 2020 through February 28, 2021, in an amount not-to-exceed \$73,000, payable pursuant to an approved budget, with the County having the sole option to renew the Agreement for up to four additional one year terms. The Agreement was subsequently executed. Your Honorable Board further authorized the County to enter into four (4) additional one year terms on April 22, 2021, March 3, 2022, April 13, 2023 and February 22, 2024 respectively. The County subsequently entered into the first, second, third and fourth amendments to the Agreement.

On May 29, 2025, your Honorable Board approved a Fifth Amendment to the Agreement in order to extend the term of the Agreement commencing retroactively on March 1, 2025 through February 28, 2026 in an amount not to exceed \$87,600. This Fifth Amendment was requested and approved in order to afford the Department adequate time to procure a new agreement through a Request for Proposals. The Fifth Amendment was subsequently executed.

The Department requires additional time to issue a Request for Proposals for a new agreement for the provision of the services currently being provided by STOP. This additional time is being requested due to additional time needed to evaluate and select a vendor. An interruption in the services being provided by STOP would prevent the Department from supervising and tracking individuals who are under the supervision of the Department.

Ordinarily under Section 5 of the Policy, the County is required to “solicit written quotations from no fewer than three persons customarily providing such goods or service and, if deemed appropriate, to inquire as to the qualifications and experiences of such persons.” However, it would not be in the best interests of the County to comply with the Policy for this Sixth Amendment to the Agreement. The Department has been satisfied with the services being provided by STOP and wishes to continue with STOP for an additional six (6) months so that a Request for Proposals can then be timely issued in order to procure a new agreement on or before August 31, 2026.

Pursuant to Section 3(a)xxi thereof, the Policy is not applicable to any procurement for which your Honorable Board determines, by resolution passed prior to commencing such procurement, that compliance with the Policy would not be in the best interests of the County. For the reasons set forth above, it is proposed that the best interests of the County would be served by exempting the procurement of this Sixth Amendment to the Agreement from the Policy.

Accordingly, a Resolution to exempt the procurement of a Sixth Amendment to the Agreement is hereby submitted for your Honorable Board’s consideration.

## RESOLUTION
