RE: Resolution to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures, pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) thereof, the procurement of additional maintenance services from Carousel Industries of North America, LLC, under a first amendment to its agreement to provide maintenance services for the individual equipment and overall system components comprising the County's Enhanced 911 system.

Authority is requested from your Honorable Board to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures, pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) thereof, the procurement of additional services, consisting of additional maintenance services concerning new 'Public Safety Answering Point' ("PSAP") equipment, (the "Additional Services") for an amount not-to-exceed \$148,440.97, under a first amendment (the "First Amendment") to an agreement between the County of Westchester (the "County") and Carousel Industries of North America, LLC ("Carousel"), pursuant to which Carousel was to provide maintenance services for the individual equipment and overall system components comprising the County's Enhanced 911 system, for the period from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026, for a total amount not to exceed \$2,562,052.11 (IT-1791; the "Agreement").

Recently, the County's PSAP at each of several locations specified plans to add additional equipment, which the County desires to have be maintained by Carousel, as the Additional Services, under the Agreement, once the additional equipment is installed.

Since 2013, the County has contracted with Carousel¹ for maintenance services for the individual equipment and overall system components comprising the County's Enhanced 911 system, with the term for the Agreement now set to expire on December 31, 2026.

Carousel has successfully performed maintenance services for the County for nearly 12

years, as noted above. Carousel maintains a 24/7 network operations center with live monitoring, critical on-site support, and local spare parts that are kept in Westchester County. Carousel also has in place a local team of dedicated technical resources with expertise related to the County's environment, infrastructure, and equipment, including technicians that have attended system training at the facilities of manufacturers.

In addition to its overall familiarity, as described above, Carousel is specifically familiar with each individual 911 center's environment, including power, uninterrupted power supplies, grounding, circuits, and interfaces to other municipality solutions (e.g., Computer Aided Dispatch software and call recording). This knowledge is crucial in providing the best of support for each 911 center.

Carousel has also engineered, installed, configured, and updated the County's existing 'Next Generation'-compatible 911 systems. As such, Carousel is intimately familiar with the systems providing for optimal performance and reliability. Carousel also maintains a lab system which allows Carousel to test system updates in the lab environment prior to deploying them in Westchester County.

Carousel, acting as an 'Authorized Agent', has also established a working relationship with Verizon, which continues to deliver 911 circuits to the County. This relationship with Verizon is a vital part of providing continuous 911 services for the County.

Furthermore, the County continuing to receive maintenance services from Carousel's existing, experienced support team would ensure uninterrupted service for the County, with no lag time that would be associated with having a new vendor 'ramp-up' and train multiple personnel to support the County's 911 systems.

In addition to all of the foregoing, it would also be impractical, if not impossible, for the County to procure the Additional Services as stand-alone services from a separate contractor, due to the nature of the services and the interconnected technologies and locations of the County's 911 systems.

Based upon the foregoing, it is proposed that the best interests of the County would be served by exempting from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures, pursuant to Section 3(a)(xxi) thereof, the procurement of the Additional Services, under the proposed First Amendment.

Accordingly, a resolution to exempt this procurement is hereby submitted for your consideration.
