Re: Request for authority to exempt from the requirements of the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures, pursuant to Section 3(a)xxi thereof, the procurement of an agreement with Aramark Correctional Services, LLC for the provision of a comprehensive food service operation that will result in prepared meals that will be served to juvenile offenders at Woodfield Cottage, Westchester County's secure detention housing.

Authority is hereby requested from your Honorable Board to exempt from the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures (the "Policy"), pursuant to Sec. 3(a)xxi thereof, the procurement of an agreement with Aramark Correctional Services, LLC ("Contractor"), for the provision of a comprehensive food service operation that will result in prepared meals that will be served to juvenile offenders at Woodfield Cottage (the "Cottage"), Westchester County's secure detention housing (the "Agreement"). Under this proposed Agreement, the Contractor will prepare food and package food on communal food trays in a central kitchen located at the County's Department of Correction County Jail. Thereafter, the Contractor will transport the communal food trays to the Cottage. Subsequently, the Contractor, on-site at the Cottage's central kitchen, will then separate and plate food for individual meals. These individual meals prepared by the Contractor will be served by the Cottage's staff, to juvenile offenders at the Cottage. The initial term of the Agreement will commence on June 1, 2026 and continue through May 31, 2027 (the "Initial Term"), with the County of Westchester (the "County"), acting by and through its Department of Probation ("Department") having the option in its sole discretion, to extend the term of the Agreement for up to three (3) additional (1) year terms thereafter (each one-year period an "Option Term") on the same terms and conditions as the Initial Term, except for the different cost terms for each Option Term, as mutually agreed upon by the County and the Contractor. In consideration for services rendered during the Initial Term, the County, acting by and through its Department, will pay the Contractor in an amount not-to-exceed \$380,551 payable pursuant to an approved budget.

Ordinarily, under Section 6 of the Procurement Policy, the County is required to solicit proposals through the issuance of a request for proposals. However, it is in the best interest of the County to exempt this Agreement because of the Contractor's professional background and experience in providing extensive quality on-site food service operations at facilities similar to Woodfield Cottage. The County has attempted to enter into an agreement with another contractor; however, an agreement was never finalized due to failed negotiations to reach a mutually beneficial agreement.

The Contractor's background and expertise exemplifies meeting nutrition guidelines, regulatory compliance, operational reliability, and food safety consistent with all applicable laws and standards governing food service operations. In fact, the Contractor and the County currently have an agreement whereby the Contractor provides a comprehensive food service at the County's Department of Correction County Jail. Because the Contractor has successfully implemented food service operations for the County, entering into an agreement with the Contractor for these services is in the best interests of the County.

Pursuant to Section 3(a) xxi, the Westchester County Procurement Policy and Procedures are not applicable to any procurement for which this Honorable Board determines, by resolution passed prior to commencing such procurement, that compliance with the policy would not be in the best interests of the County. For the reasons set forth above, it is proposed that the best interests of the County would be served by exempting the procurement of an Agreement with Contractor from the County Procurement Policy.

Accordingly, a Resolution to exempt the procurement of an agreement with Contractor is hereby submitted for your Honorable Board's consideration.
